The Cure for Injustice

Proverbs 19:17
Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will repay him for his deed.

We are "the poor" and Jesus was repaid for our injustice by being treated with horrendous injustice.

And we are repaid for his righteousness.

⁵ For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶ who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.

Matthew 27:46
And about the ninth hour
Jesus cried out with a loud
voice..."My God, my God, why
have you forsaken me?"

We now have Jesus' record and are treated

Galatians 4

⁶ And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" ⁷ So you are no longer a slave, but a

son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

And this changes my view and pursuit of Justice.

Isaiah 35:10

And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

The Cause of Justice...in my life...

Romans 12:19-20

Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." ²⁰ To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head."

What would it mean to be freed from forcing justice?

What does it actually mean to love my neighbor?

Matthew 5

³⁸ "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' ³⁹ But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. ⁴⁰ And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. ⁴¹ And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles. ⁴² Give to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you.

The Cause of Justice...on behalf of others...

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- 19:17 Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the LORD,

Matthew 25

was thirsty and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶ I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' ⁴⁰ And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

Micah 6:8 He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

The price for our self-centeredness has been paid and we've been set free from it's prison, called and empowered to live other-ward.
