
Deceitful Words

John 6:47

We are value-fragile and want others to give us significance.

To Ourselves

We forget the gospel-gift of value we have in Jesus

"Truly, truly" = "Amen, Amen" saying it *before* he speaks reveals truth and power.

John 8:58
Jesus said to them, "*Truly, truly*, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am."

John 14:6
Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

He speaks the TRUTH because He IS the TRUTH

John 12:24 TRULY, TRULY, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit

John 14:12-17

"TRULY, TRULY, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father.... ¹⁵ "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, ¹⁷ even the *Spirit of Truth*...for he dwells with you and will be in you.

Truth & Love: with Others

Love them enough to mutually grow in Christ-likeness

Love them enough to not make it all about you

"Love without truth is sentimentality; it supports and affirms us but keeps us in denial about our flaws. Truth without love is harshness; it gives us information but in such a way that we cannot really hear it. God's saving love in Christ, however, is marked by both radical truthfulness about who we are and yet also radical, unconditional commitment to us. The merciful commitment strengthens us to see the truth about ourselves and repent. The conviction and repentance moves us to cling to and rest in God's mercy and grace."
